Hello everyone, and welcome to spring!

All in all, it was a quiet winter here at the lake and we are all eagerly awaiting the return of our seasonal friends and neighbours for another beautiful summer at the lake. A few properties have changed hands in the last few months, so as a reminder, please familiarize yourself with the bylaws as they pertain to your properties (these bylaws can be found on our website). We welcome these new neighbours!

We remain in a good financial position and it helps to have a Municipal Corporate Plan to support the decision-making process and long-term strategic planning.

Our new fire service partnership is working well, along with our new Community Peace Officer (CPO) contract with Lac Ste. Anne County. Council as well as others in the Summer Village, have noticed the frequency of the CPO patrols have increased from what our previous provider supplied. Our new CPOs will also be enforcing new bylaws including, but not limited to, parking and speeding violations. Speed bumps are coming back this summer, as unfortunately, they still seem to be necessary.

This summer, MCSNet will be installing fibre optic cable throughout the Summer Village at NO CHARGE to residents or the Summer Village. MCSNet will be coming through the Summer Village shortly to get permission to access your property, so please watch for that.

As most of you already know, we will no longer be selling garbage tokens so we are installing our own garbage bins in the Summer Village.

Council also decided this summer to install lake buoys to mark off where motorized boats are not allowed, except to dock. Please respect these new demarcations as they exist to protect every lake user.

Please remember that many of the community activities that make our Summer Village a great place are run by volunteers and their efforts are always greatly appreciated.

2026 MUNICIPAL TAXES

Please note the following important deadlines related to your 2026 Assessment and Tax Notices:

Taxes - are due by 12:00 midnight on:

June 30th, 2026

Current Year Tax Penalties (18%) - will be applied to current year tax balances owing on:

July 1st, 2026

Property Assessment Complaints - the deadline for appeals is:

July 24th, 2026

Tax Arrears Penalties (18%) - will be applied to total account balances owing on:

January 1st, 2027

Taxes, Budgets, and Assessments

Annual taxes are a byproduct of the approved budget and property assessments. Budgets tell us how much we need to collect to pay for the municipality's required and discretionary spending, and property assessments are the basic way of apportioning these costs across all ratepayers.

Municipalities are required to pass balanced budgets. They are also required to collect revenue and remit payment for many external (provincial) assessment-based services (such as School Requisitions, Provincial Policing and Senior Foundation Requisitions). Council has control over some spending (the municipal budget) and how to source revenue (taxes, grants, reserves, borrowing), but it is also often the bearer of tough news when passing down costs from the province.

Budget 2026 was a challenging undertaking, but Council was able to hold municipal tax increases to just over █% for 2026. Unfortunately, School, Provincial Policing and Seniors Housing Requisitions increased by over █%, offsetting some of that fiscal prudence in Council's core budget. Details on the current year and future priorities in each budget function, as well as trend notes, will be found in the MCP once available.

If you have questions regarding the assessed value of your property, please contact the municipal assessor, Travis Horne (Travis.Horne@masg.ca), to discuss before filing a formal complaint.

MAKING A PAYMENT?

The municipality accepts several payment methods for collecting payments. In addition to cheques, bank drafts and cash, payments can also be received by e-transfer through your banking institution. To pay by e-transfer please add the summer village as a payee and send to payments@svnakamun.com (payments will be auto-deposited, no password required but please include your Roll # in the reference line).

We also offer a convenient monthly payment plan, contact the office to learn more or register.

Take Notice of Local Fire Bans and Restrictions

We are again expecting a very dry spring and summer season in 2026. Please help keep our community safe by observing responsible fire practices; when enjoying a recreational fire, be sure to use an approved fire pit with a spark arrestor/screen, never leave a fire unattended, and be sure to thoroughly soak the embers with water before leaving the site.

Be sure to check the website and village signage for current fire restrictions/bans before starting a fire and consult the Fire Bylaw for additional regulations and provisions regarding fire protection and fire bans.

Fibre Internet is coming to SVN

Homes and businesses around Lac La Nonne, within Lac Ste. Anne County and the Summer Villages of Nakamun Park and Birch Cove will be receiving fibre internet thanks to grants received by MCSNet from the Universal Broadband Fund (UBF) and Alberta Broadband Fund (ABF).

Continued Enforcement Services Partnership

Council is pleased to announce a continued partnership with Lac Ste. Anne County for the provision of Community Peace Officer, Bylaw Enforcement, and Animal Control Services, which started May 1, 2025.

As our closest regional partner, this partnership is expected to provide an enhanced service. In addition to the renewal of regular patrols through the community, and the expansion of service scope to include bylaw and animal control services, the agreement gives access to additional officers operating closer to the area. Council is encouraged at the prospect of more comprehensive and more responsive enforcement services going forward.

Reminder - New Fire Protection Policies

Council passed a Fire Protection framework in 2024, and these policies remain in effect:

a) **Fire Services Bylaw:**

- Adding clarity to the fire ban process and permitted/prohibited uses.
- Prohibiting fireworks (except with prior approval for special events)

b) **Fire Ban Declaration Policy:**

- Adding consistency with our regional partners (Lac Ste Anne County)

c) **Fees and Charges Bylaw:**

- More substantial fines and penalties for violations of fire regulations.

Noise Bylaw #2020-4

Residents and guests are reminded to observe and respect Noise Bylaw #2020-4. This includes not operating equipment between 11:00 p.m. and 7:30 a.m. daily. Violations can lead to tickets, charges, and fines, as incorporated in the legislation.

Rich Valley Truck Fill Station

The nearest WILD Water truck fill station is located just north and east of Rich Valley on TWP Rd 564. Commercial and private haulers have been using this station since 2023. If you would like to arrange access, please open an account at: www.water-fill.com or by calling 1(844) 509-2837

Priority Access:

Please be mindful of emergency vehicles at truck fill stations. If a fire truck or other emergency vehicle is in line with their lights flashing and sirens on, please make way and give them priority access to the station.

Pickleball Court Project Update

Council's proposal to build a Pickleball court has received a strong mandate to proceed. The results of the survey had 70% unequivocally in favour, 22% in favour contingent on the Summer Village receiving all or partial grant funding, and 8% against the proposal.

The Summer Village is in a position to proceed with the project this year, however, Council has decided to take a fiscally cautious approach and postpone the project until spring of 2027. This delay will allow the Summer Village to pay down our existing weed cutter loan and clear space in our existing Capital Gains Program. Additional grant funding is also being investigated. This additional time will also allow Council to finalize the project costs in order to achieve budget savings. In addition, there are operational logistics and maintenance issues to review and fine tune. It is also anticipated that volunteers will be willing to step up to help reduce construction costs and help with operational concerns.

Barring some unforeseen financial hardship on the Summer Village in the next year, the plan is to break ground May of 2027 and have the project completed by June next year.

RULES FOR DOCKS

Under the mandate of the Provincial Government (Alberta Environment and Parks), the regulations were updated in April 2021. The revised "Disturbance Standard for Temporary Seasonal Docks & Other Mooring Structures for Personal Recreational Purposes" was created to set the maximum acceptable footprint for temporary seasonal docks, temporary seasonal boat lifts and associated mooring structures for personal recreational purposes on the beds and shores of Alberta's recreational lakes and rivers. The disturbance standard creates a general permission for most waterfront, semi-waterfront and municipal dock owners and eliminates the need for residents to apply for an authorization to the Province if they abide by the standards.

Please note that application for a **Letter of No Objection** must still be made to the municipality if the seasonal dock/boat lift is adjacent to municipal property. Council maintains a policy allowing for prior permit holders (renewals) to be granted a multi-year authorization when warranted.
